

## **Logistics for Poster Presenters**

Presenting a poster allows you to communicate your research at a one-on-one level. The Poster session will be held on Thursday, May 11th from 18:30 -20:00 in the Loft.

## **Presentation Equipment**

The poster session area will be equipped with:

- Designated poster board
- Materials to mount the poster
- Small round table for laptop
- Chair

Be sure to check your <u>poster board number</u>. These are subject to change. Find up-to-date information in the <u>online program</u>, or at the information/registration desk.

Please note that audiovisuals are not allowed in poster sessions. Posters should be designed using effective printed visuals.

## Successful Presentation Setup

Make sure that your poster fits the criteria for JupyterCon (refer to our <u>Tips for Designing a Poster Presentation</u>). Your poster must fit on the provided poster board: 960 x 2050mm (3.15 x 6.73'); Portrait view. Your poster must correspond to the title and content of the abstract listed in the online program.

Put your poster up in the specified location at least 20 minutes prior to the start of the session, and stay with your poster during the entire session. The posters will be displayed for the entire conference and will be on display within the conference space on the final day. Make sure to take your poster (plus any personal items) with you by the end of the conference; posters that are not removed may be disposed of.

## **During Your Presentation**

Remember, it pays to practice! You never know who will stop by to ask about your project. Clearly communicate your research and its value by implementing our <u>Tips for Presenting a Scientific Poster</u>.
